Detox

There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end, it leads to death.

– Proverbs 14:12

"Let us lay aside everything that hinders and the sin which so easily gets us side-tracked, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith."

- Hebrews 12:1,2

The testimony of King Jesus is the spirit of prophecy (Revelation 19:10). However, students of Bible prophecy who have embraced a "Dispensational" view of the End Times, have unknowingly been ingesting toxins in their diet of theology

and preventing themselves from knowing King Jesus fully.

Dispensationalist eschatology is extremely erroneous and has poisoned the minds of many sincere Christians. It has dulled their senses so that they have been distracted from what is really going on in the world – especially in the areas of science, technology, media, social engineering, banking, and supernatural deception. They are unaware of the danger that they are in, and they are ill-equipped to serve King Jesus today and in coming days. They need a major detox to get their minds clear for the task before them!

Sadly, for most Christians, it is already too late to get a detox. They have already had their DNA changed and now belong to Satan. However, there is still time for the remnant of true Christians who still have their God-given DNA to get some detoxification. All that is needed is a

humble heart, a love for the Truth, careful investigation along, and guidance from the Holy Spirit. Below is a brief overview of six toxic aspects of Dispensational teaching and what is needed for a detox:

1. Ignorance of the Beast

Dispensationalism wrongly teaches that the 7-headed Beast of Revelation 13 and Daniel 7:23 is the Antichrist and not a digital kingdom. The Antichrist will be a man who comes out of the kingdom (Daniel 7:17, 24,25). He will only have one head, not seven. The Beast kingdom is the infrastructure that he will use to control the world. The result is that millions of Christians have wrongly assumed that the Mark of the Beast will not be rolled out until after the Antichrist emerges on the public scene. Tragically, this has led millions of Christians to forfeit their salvation by allowing the Mark to be delivered to

their bodies and change their God-given DNA.

2. Wrong Temple

Dispensationalists typically believe that the Temple of God in which an abomination causes desolation (Daniel 11:31; 12:11; Matthew 24:15; Mark 13:14) is a building in Jerusalem.

However, the Bible is clear that the true Temple of God at this time in history is the bodies of God's people (Acts 2:1-4; 1 Corinthians 3:16; 6:19,20; 2 Corinthians 6:16; Ephesians 2:19-22). The wrong teaching is also due to the assumption that the abomination that the Lord Jesus spoke of is a repeat of what Antiochus Epiphanes did in 167BC (1 Maccabees 1:54) and an ignorance of synthetic biology, nano technology, and the Internet of Biological Things. When Messiah the Prince returns, there will indeed be a

new holy temple building (Ezekiel 40-46), but any temple building prior to that will be of Satan, and it will be unholy and unable to be made desolate, because it is already desolate. Even some Orthodox Jews teach this. For example, the [True Torah Jews](#) say that if the Zionists succeed in building a temple, “it will not be the long-awaited Third Temple of G-d, but a temple of Satanic forces.”

3. Artificial Division

Dispensationalism wrongly divides what God has brought together – the Jews and the Gentiles into one body (Ephesians 2:11-3:10) – so that most think that only Jewish believers (and not Gentile believers) will have to go through the Great Tribulation. What the Bible teaches is that Jewish believers will indeed be treated separately, being taken into the wilderness (Revelation

12:13-16), while Gentile believers have to do spiritual warfare against the Dragon (Revelation 12:17). However, the Gentile believers at that time should already know about the full armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-20) and all the Bible prophecies and thus be ready. The Jewish believers will not have had such prior knowledge, so God will make things easier for them based on their limitations.

4. Avoidance of suffering

Dispensationalism wrongly teaches that the rapture and the resurrection of the Church are two separate events. They fail to see that it is a single event that occurs at the seventh and last trumpet blast (Matthew 24:30,31; 1 Corinthians 15:51,52; Revelation 10:7). It must come after the final 42 months of testing and purification (Daniel 7:23-25, 12:7,10,11, Revelation 11:2-6, 12:6,17;

13:5,6). Thus, Dispensationalists wrongly expect a Caesarean section-type escape from the pain of the child-bearing labor that the Lord Jesus Christ warned of in Matthew 24:8. This is partly due to the natural tendency of the flesh to avoid suffering and want to be a part of the world system. Sadly, in this Laodicean Church era, proper teaching about the role of suffering and separation from the world is not seeker friendly, so it is often ignored in churches. Nevertheless, it is essential for preparation for eternity (2 Corinthians 6:14-7:1; Philippians 1:29; Colossians 1:24; James 1:2-4; 1 Peter 2:20,21; 4:1, Revelation 3:14-21, 18:4, etc.)

5. Wrong confirmation

Dispensationalism wrongly teaches that the Great Tribulation is 7 years long, even though the Bible never mentions a

7-year tribulation period.

Dispensationalists typically do this because many modern Bible translators have not understood the idea of God bringing His people under his wings (Strong's H3671, kānāp), as mentioned in Ruth 2:11, 3:8-13 or Psalm 91:4, or God spreading His cloak (also Strong's H3671, kānāp) over their nakedness and abominations as talked in Ezekiel 16:1-14. Thus, people who read modern translations Daniel 9:27 are led to wrongly believe that the verse is talking about the Antichrist rather than Jesus Christ. Therefore, they miss the point that it was the Lord Jesus Christ who was already confirming the everlasting covenant (Jeremiah 31:31-34; Ezekiel 37:26-28; Matthew 26:28) during the first 3 ½ years of the 70th week of Daniel. It has nothing to do with any treaty that the Antichrist will confirm. They also miss the point that

Jesus Christ will continue to confirm the everlasting covenant during the second 3 ½ years of the 70th week of Daniel. He will do this through His people – both Jewish and Gentile believers – because He lives in them (Romans 8:10; Colossians 1:27). The dispensational view fails to see God's purposes in Daniel 9:24-27 as a whole and in the context of Daniel 9:1-23, and it ignores that fact that God has grafted the Gentiles into the people of God (Romans 11). Basically, Dispensationalism is a knee-jerk reaction to displacement theology – the incorrect idea that the Church has replaced the Jews. The proper Biblical concept is ingrafting (Romans 11) or abiding in the True Vine (John 15:1-8). Thus, both believing Jews and Gentiles together inherit all the promises that God made to the Jews in the Old Testament.

6. Kabbalist support

Dispensationalists typically teach that God is somehow pleased with a secular Jewish state controlled by Kabbalists (Rothschilds, Rockefellers, etc.) that rejects Jesus as its Messiah and that emerged in 1948. This teaching makes many Christians today fail to see the modern Jewish state as Satan's counterfeit of the Church, which was born on Pentecost – a nation born in one day (Isaiah 66:8; Acts 2). Surely, the Kabbalists and Zionists have had their hand in supporting Dispensationalism for all of the above reasons, especially this one – because it has allowed them to do the work of Satan without Bible-believing Christians doing anything to hinder them. Sadly, many Christians have unknowingly been supporting the Kabbalist agenda rather than being repulsed by it! (For
